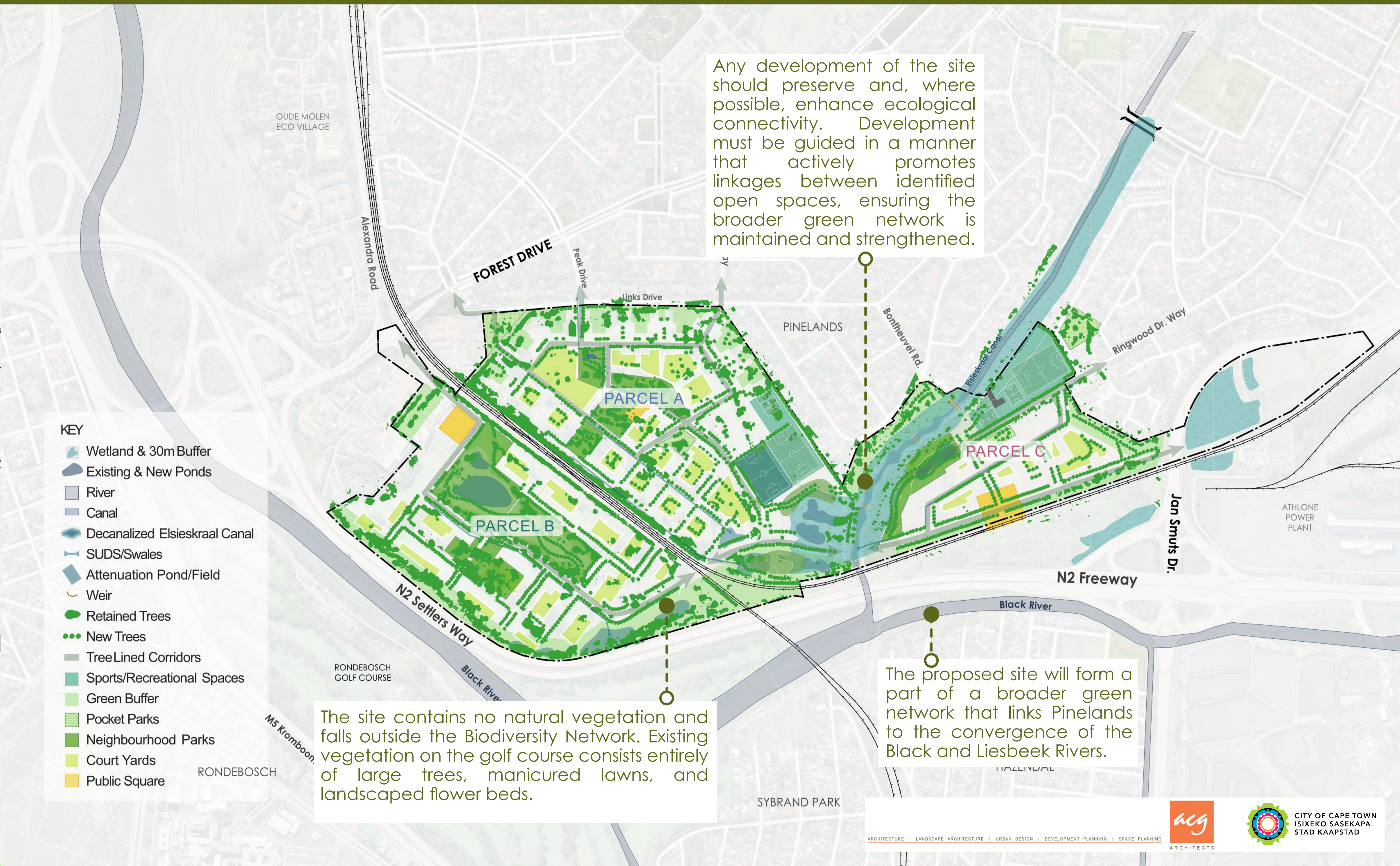


# LANDSCAPE INFORMANTS: GREEN NETWORK

## REDEVELOPMENT OF THE KING DAVID MOWBRAY GOLF COURSE AND SURROUNDS



Any development of the site should preserve and, where possible, enhance ecological connectivity. Development must be guided in a manner that actively promotes linkages between identified open spaces, ensuring the broader green network is maintained and strengthened.

The site contains no natural vegetation and falls outside the Biodiversity Network. Existing vegetation on the golf course consists entirely of large trees, manicured lawns, and landscaped flower beds.

The proposed site will form a part of a broader green network that links Pinelands to the convergence of the Black and Liesbeek Rivers.
