REDEVELOPMENT OF THE KING DAVID MOWBRAY GOLF COURSE AND SURROUNDS



Surveys were conducted on the site to determine whether it supports any threatened frog or reptile species. During the surveys there were observations of the African Clawed Frog, the Clicking Stream Frog and the Cape Dwarf Chameleon. No species of conservation concern were observed on the site.



There is a significant opportunity for improvement and restoration of foraging and breeding habitats, specifically for Western Leopard Toads. The removal of fish from the wetlands and ponds, management of weeds in combination with the general halting of pesticide use may enable this species to return and breed successfully.



It was recommended that the proposed development design allow for open spaces and ponds that cater for Western Leopard Toad requirements.
